THE CANDY CANE

When we see a candy cane we think of Jesus, the Good Shepherd. Let its shape remind us of a shepherd's crook and the words of Jesus, "I am the Good Shepherd, I know my own and my own know me." (John 10:14). As the white colour of the body of the cane causes us to think of the purity of Jesus, let the red stripes help us remember the blood of His sacrifice. "But he was wounded for our transgressions ..." (Isaiah 53:5). The fragrance of peppermint is symbolic of hyssop, a bushy herb used in purification rites. David asks God, "Purge me with hyssop and I shall be clean..." (Psalm 51:7). As we break and share a Candy Cane, recall His words, "This is my body that is for you...?" (1 Corinthians 11:24).
