FROM THE PASTOR

This will be my 12th New Year's Newsletter. I wondered ABOUT what we have done in those past 12 years. Here is a quick journey through some of the Pastor's new year's notes. I have left a space for you to add a tick mark or write a comment – do you remember these events?

□ 2013 - BUT WHAT IF?

Maybe the first card game you ever learned to play was 'snap'. The rules are simple then the thinking comes, "But what if we both shout SNAP at the same time?" That's how we deal with a lot of things in life.

The rule says this, and somebody will go digging to find a, "But what if?" question.

I recently was asked question about baptism that prodded my thinking on this. Can I have my son baptised **not as part** of the regular Sunday morning worship? My first reaction was to ask why and I got a good answer. But how does that become an event for our faith community? This baptism was not part of our normal public worship calendar, "But what if the community came to join in that event on that day?" Since that 2012 baptism, I also did a full immersion for Suhasini in 2018 – that was a Saturday morning – again I invited the community to come.

2014 - FONT, BANNERS & SONGS, (OH MY!)

Consider these three things from the past few months:

In the summer edition of our Trinity Times, I wrote about raising banners and quoted from the praise song My Redeemer Lives: "I'll raise a banner, cause my lord has conquered the grave". On August 4th our fledgling praise band introduced that song the congregation ... It has become one of our favourites.

A 'crafty' work party made some new banners for our sanctuary. Each banner makes a statement about our faith and as we raise these new banners, we raise up what we hold as important to our faith lives. The banner at the front beside the altar, now (2023) has a pulley system so it can be changed with out climbing up on a chair with a big stick.

We have moved the font from its somewhat hidden location near front of the sanctuary to make it mobile. On January 12th, 2014, we asked God to bless our work as we dedicated the banners and the new font arrangement.

I was so, so proud of all the work of our Trinity members that made these happen.

2015 - EBOLA AID FOR LIBERIA

On December 6th Trinity hosted a Praise Band Concert to raise funds for Ebola Aid for Liberia. Our first goal was to raise money and we did ... \$1255 plus some donations of soap and medical gloves.

Our second goal was to praise in an ecumenical mood. This too we did. We had praise bands from London Christian Fellowship International (LCFI), Community Bible Church and Trinity Lutheran, along with song and music from Sonja Dennis of Colborne United Church and our own Trudi Johnston and Ross McDonald. The assembly was filled with members, friends and family from the gathered congregations. The final musical set was the joyous sounds of London's Liberian Community leading us with their traditional dance and song. As Leo Johnson said "Worship is an attitude" and that night we danced and sang many praises to God.

2016 - SYRIAN REFUGEES - TRINITY'S REFORMATION CHALLENGE

"Then the King will say to those on his right, 'Enter, you who are blessed by my Father! Take what's coming to you in this kingdom. It's been ready for you since the world's foundation. And here's why:

I was hungry and you fed me,

I was thirsty and you gave me a drink,

I was homeless and you gave me a room,

I was shivering and you gave me clothes,

I was sick and you stopped to visit,

I was in prison and you came to me.'

Our joint application (with Redeemer and St. Andrew) for a refugee family will be processed through the Anglican Church's Huron Diocese here in London - they will be the sponsoring agency. Once the application is accepted it will take between 1 and 4 months before a family would arrive. The

three congregations will be responsible for 12 months of support for the family from finances for rent, food and clothing etc. to assistance in integrating into our London community and whatever care and support the family might need.

TRINITY GOALS:

- 1. Raise \$7,000 by February 2016.
- 2. Form a group of 10 or more individuals to support the family.

Our other two partners in the team have the same goals.
