

RETURNING TO IN-PERSON WORSHIP

As the COVID-19 vaccine distribution increases and most of our congregation has had at least one dose, I believe that when we open our doors for in-personworship, it will be our LAST reopening. I think when we open up, we will not need to close again.

So, what does that mean for our worship services? Do we go back to everything just as it was before? Or, after our on-line worship experience, do we reflect on and change the how and what we do?

The pre-recorded on-line worship services moved us towards a shorter and more condensed worship. It also made worship more available to some of our congregation who had not been able to attend on a Sunday morning at Trinity every week. Here are some of the things I have been pondering and will be working though with our Worship Team as we plan for reopening and beyond.

THINGS WE HAVE BEEN DOING ONLINE:

- Mostly using ONE scripture text each week
- Using ONE reader each week (most of the time) for prayers and scripture
- Prayers of the people each week
- Maintaining a choir to lead the hymn singing plus occasional anthems
- Weekly postludes as a time of reflection
- Using less liturgical singing (Kyrie, Gospel Acclamation, etc.)
- Using images and on-screen text as an assist with the sermon
- Video sermons from the ELCIC Bishops
- Communion once per month
- Occasional worship sharing with other congregations
- Making music videos segments for special occasions

THINGS WE DID NOT DO ONLINE:

- Regular time of confession
- Sharing the peace
- Weekly preludes
- Weekly communion
- Not using the FULL sung liturgy
- Coffee time and meals I know these are NOT worship per se, but I believe they are an essential piece of the Sunday-going-tochurch experience

I have two questions for you:

- 1. What are the things **you would add** to my two lists?
- 2. What are the pieces of worship **you would say are MUST-HAVES** when we get back to a stabilized in-person worship pattern?
