PASTOR'S MESSAGE – I CHOOSE HOPE

A few years ago I put a HOPE-O-METER on the font right in the middle of the sanctuary. During my sermon I invited folks to put a marker into one of five containers to display their level of HOPE from zero to four.

I was surprised to see a few markers in the ZERO container. I was hoping the ZERO container would have no markers. I think HOPE is a marker of faith. Just like FAITH is a sign of your belief WITHOUT evidence ... otherwise it would not be FAITH. If you have proof of something, you don't need to have FAITH.

Many, many, congregations are having difficulties these days; finance, attendance, volunteers, hope and it is easy to lose HOPE. But I think HOPE is a choice ... in spite of evidence that could lead to despair. HOPE does not need to be blind to the realities of our world, but our **choice of HOPE** is how we can approach the future, near and far.

May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. (*Romans* 15:13)


