FROM THE PASTOR

What does it mean to be Lutheran?

"I was born and raised Lutheran", I have heard people say. Often that means: I have German ancestry, my parents went to a Lutheran Church and I was baptised in a Lutheran church. All gooden schtuff – ja?

To start with — nobody is baptised Lutheran, Anglican, Roman Catholic or otherwise. We are all baptised into the Christian faith — we are all one in Christ. Yes, membership of a particular congregation and denomination follows baptism — but baptism itself is into the joys and promises of Christ followed by a commitment to a life of discipleship.

So maybe it is attending a Lutheran Sunday School that makes you Lutheran? But having attended a Presbyterian Sunday School, I can tell you that we learned the same stories that our Lutheran Sunday School children are learning now (creation, Joseph and his coat, Moses and the ten commandments, Jesus' birth, his life, crucifixion and resurrection). I'm sure there are many more that you would add to the essential stories list.

So, what does it mean to be Lutheran?

Like many and most Christians, we claim the Apostle's and Nicene creeds to be true statements of what we believe, so the creeds alone do not define our Lutheranism. We do have another statement of faith that truly is a mark of Lutheranism. The Book of Concord is the authoritative collection of what defines us as Lutheran and it contains the Augsburg Confession, the Catechisms of Martin Luther, the three creeds and more. The Augsburg confession is the key document defining Lutheran doctrine, yet that is a document that tends to only get studied by seminarians, pastors and scholars. Yet many of you know the three marks that would summarise what is means to be a Lutheran:

- Word Alone: we lift scripture above traditions and human constructs of what we believe.
- Faith Alone: we lift up the gift of faith to be all that we need to receive forgiveness through Jesus.
- Grace Alone: we cannot earn God's love and forgiveness in anyway it is God's gift to us.

These are good and true statements – and here we stand and we can do no other.

Being Lutheran means being part of a Lutheran congregation and being part of a larger Lutheran Church body – for us that means the Eastern Synod and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada. While we fully agree that faith and grace alone is enough, we can also see marks of faithfulness and discipleship by how we respond to the gifts of faith and grace. We could simply respond "I've been saved by grace and I don't need to do anything else" or we could respond "I've been saved by grace – Wow! Thanks be to God! Now, how can I help others though my love for Christ?"



Back to School is almost upon us and the heat and humidity of the last few weeks will be starting to turn into perfect warm days and cool evenings. I pray you have been able to get outdoors and for everyone to be able to be out and about and enjoy the sunshine and visiting with friends and family.

COVID-19 has not gone away and everyone must remain vigilant but hopefully with more and more getting vaccinated it will diminish and be a virus that can be controlled with an annual booster shot. No guarantee but we can hope and pray.

RETURN TO IN-PERSON WORSHIP

It is with extreme pleasure that Council was able to reopen the church on August 15th for in-person worship services. We still need to wear our masks through the entire service and continue to follow the Middlesex Health Unit and Ontario Government guidelines. We do not, however, have to register in advance. You must, however, sign in when you arrive providing your name and telephone number.

Pastor and the Worship Team have worked hard to get Trinity to the point where our in-person services are able to be watched by those at home via Zoom on the day of the actual service. EARTHQUAKE IN HAITI EMERGENCY APPEAL


