## **THE FUTURE – GOD - CHANGE**

The future is a daunting thing. We don't know with certainty what the months and years ahead will bring. The 3 and 4 year olds are going to school and maybe leaving their parents for the first time. Maybe they need to ride on a big school bus ... without seat belts. On CBC London this morning they interviewed some very young and new school bus riders that had been offered a first trip from the school, around the block, and back again. One child said, "I'm a bit scared, but mostly excited."

At the other end of the local school system, maybe our young adults are heading to a college or university, maybe in another city or even another country, again away from mom, dad, siblings and grandparents for the first time. But these young adults already know that they can adapt. They will have changed school 3 times at least by this stage.

Our church world is also looking at the future as a daunting time. We live in a world that is not like it was when we were youngsters, off to Sunday School with 10s and 10s of other kids. This current world is not our parent's world, nor our grandparent's world, and neither is church. Maybe we can learn from the youngsters. Maybe their willingness to accept change can inspire us. Maybe being willing to adapt to new situations can be part of our spiritual way of being.

In 1849, French writer Jean-Baptiste Alphonse Karr wrote "plus ça change, plus c'est la même chose " – the more things change, the more they stay the same.

#### Scripture tells us:

- What has been will be again, what has been done will be done again; there is nothing new under the sun. Ecclesiastes 1:9

How does that make sense? If we look at reality on a deeper level, we still have relationships with family, friends, church, the earth, God ... what in those relationships is different than for our grandparents ... or even further back? The surface level stuff will look like change – **but deep down** – I would say it stays the same.

I do wonder about one aspect on my list; our relationship with the earth. It is a gift from God, and a responsibility for us to care for it.

- God spoke: "Let us make human beings in our image, make them reflecting our nature so they can be responsible for the fish in the sea, the birds in the air, the cattle, and, yes, Earth itself, and every animal that moves on the face of Earth." Genesis 1:26-28

Seeing the wildfires, floods and other weather extremes would be good evidence that we are not being responsible for Earth itself. Not my problem? "We didn't start the fire; It was always burning, since the world's been turning; We didn't start the fire; No, we didn't light it, but we tried to fight it." The 'prophet' Joel (Billy that is, 1989).

If we look at reality on a deeper level, we still have relationships with family, friends, church, and the earth. I missed one item, God. It was at the end of my list above, but really ... should be first.

- Jesus said, "The first in importance is, 'Listen, Israel: The Lord your God is one; so, love the Lord God with all your passion and prayer and intelligence and energy.' And here is the second: 'Love others as well as you love yourself.' There is no other commandment that ranks with these." Mark 12: 29-31

That is what we can and should do when looking at the future:

Love God then neighbour (including the earth), and be willing to accept change and adapt to new situations as part of our spiritual way of being.

# INSHALLAH-LONDON IS LAUNCHING AGAIN

## What is Inshallah?

It is an Arabic-language expression: in shā' Allāh, meaning literally "if God wills".

Inshallah-London is a group of people who love to sing music that especially promotes hope, peace and justice in the world through the lenses of many cultures and traditions.

In 2017, Pastor Steve was asked to start this London group by Debbie Lou Ludolph, the leader of the

original Inshallah group in Waterloo and the director of the Kanata Centre for Worship and Global Song at the Martin Luther University College (formerly Waterloo Lutheran Seminary). We ran for 3 years until the pandemic shut us down in 2020 – all singing groups and choirs closed up at that time.

But we are now able to launch Inshallah London again this September 12<sup>th</sup> at 5:30 pm. We sing for about an hour and we are a group of people who want to make and enjoy friends through music. Many of the songs we sing are "village" type songs, that is, the music that is usually taught by one person sharing with another, then another, and the next thing you know is everyone in the village knows it and will join in.

#### But I can't read music

Ability to read music is helpful **but not necessary**. Again, think of the "village" idea. It is helpful if you can sing and hold a note — which most people can. We teach the parts and others sing with you to "hold your hand", singing wise.

We also invite people to share music from their tradition, culture and language with sensitivity to social inclusion. We sing in various languages: English, French, Hebrew, Spanish and Arabic. We are lucky to have some members of the group that are fluent (enough) to teach and explain the pronunciation and meanings.

We are not performance focussed, but rather, sing for our own pleasure and as prayer to promote hope, peace and justice. Sometimes we sing with, or for, other groups of people.
