PASTOR'S NOTES

Our world has changed and it affects our church. It has been changing significantly since (at least) the 1960s and in a fuller reality, our church has been changing since its formation in the first century.

Phyllis Tickle was an American author and lecturer whose work focused on spirituality and religion issues. She brought us the idea that from the church's birth to the reign of St. Gregory the great, to the Great Schism and through the Reformation (1517), that every 500 years the church has been rocked by massive transitions. She would claim that we in in one of those transitions right now. She says that there are usually one or more key factors that precede the transition and for our time, the contraceptive pill is one of key factors.

Women's groups, in pretty much every (northern /western) church, have closed or are running out of steam. The ELCIC's Evangelical Lutheran Women (ELW) group closed in 2010. Bishop Susan Johnson wrote about that ministry,

"Perhaps ELW's greatest gift has been in the opportunity it provided for Lutheran women, from across Canada, to be joined together in common cause. Whether it was gathering for national, synodical, or conference ELW events, participating in ELW Bible Studies, or learning about social justice issues, ELW provided a network of relationships which knit Lutheran women together in a sense of common mission."

Every church feels that loss. Many, or most, women these days work outside the home and are not available to do what the women's groups in the past were able to do. Also, gender roles in society have changed significantly since the 1960s. Things ain't what they used to be.

I am still asking these questions with the Facing the Future Team.

Who are we?

What is important to us?

How are we relevant to the world (near & far)?

In my sermon on 25th February, I talked about faith and trust and that I think they really are the same thing, or maybe they are the two sides of the same coin. I left the congregation with a question, "What does your trust in God help you to do?" I think I will ask that of our Facing the Future Team. This was the implied fourth question:

"What does our trust in God help us to do?"

The English translation is "love-feast", and it
differs from a Seder meal which is the Jewish
ritual meal that was the "Last Supper"
Passover meal that Jesus shared with the
apostles.

The Agape meal is a simple and ordinary meal shared within a Christian Community. It is a time for conversation, prayer and includes that "new thing" that Jesus did at the Passover meal, Holy Communion and his words, "do this in remembrance of me".

After the meal we will strip Trinity altar ready for Good Friday.

To understand the causes and origins of Agape feasts, let us first take a look at the lifestyles of the early Christians in the first years after the Ascension of Christ. That was a time of intense eschatological expectations. Conversions were deeply transformative. New members of the Christian Church parted with unbelief and fear and fully dedicated themselves to the divine. Christians were anticipating the second coming of the Lord. Unlike people like you and me, they had a direct sense of belonging to New Jerusalem, a kingdom not of this world. With this sentiment, they rejected the pursuit of any earthly goals and dedicated themselves mainly to the service of God and their neighbour. The suppers of love, or agape meals, centred around the Eucharist, became an expression of this trend.
